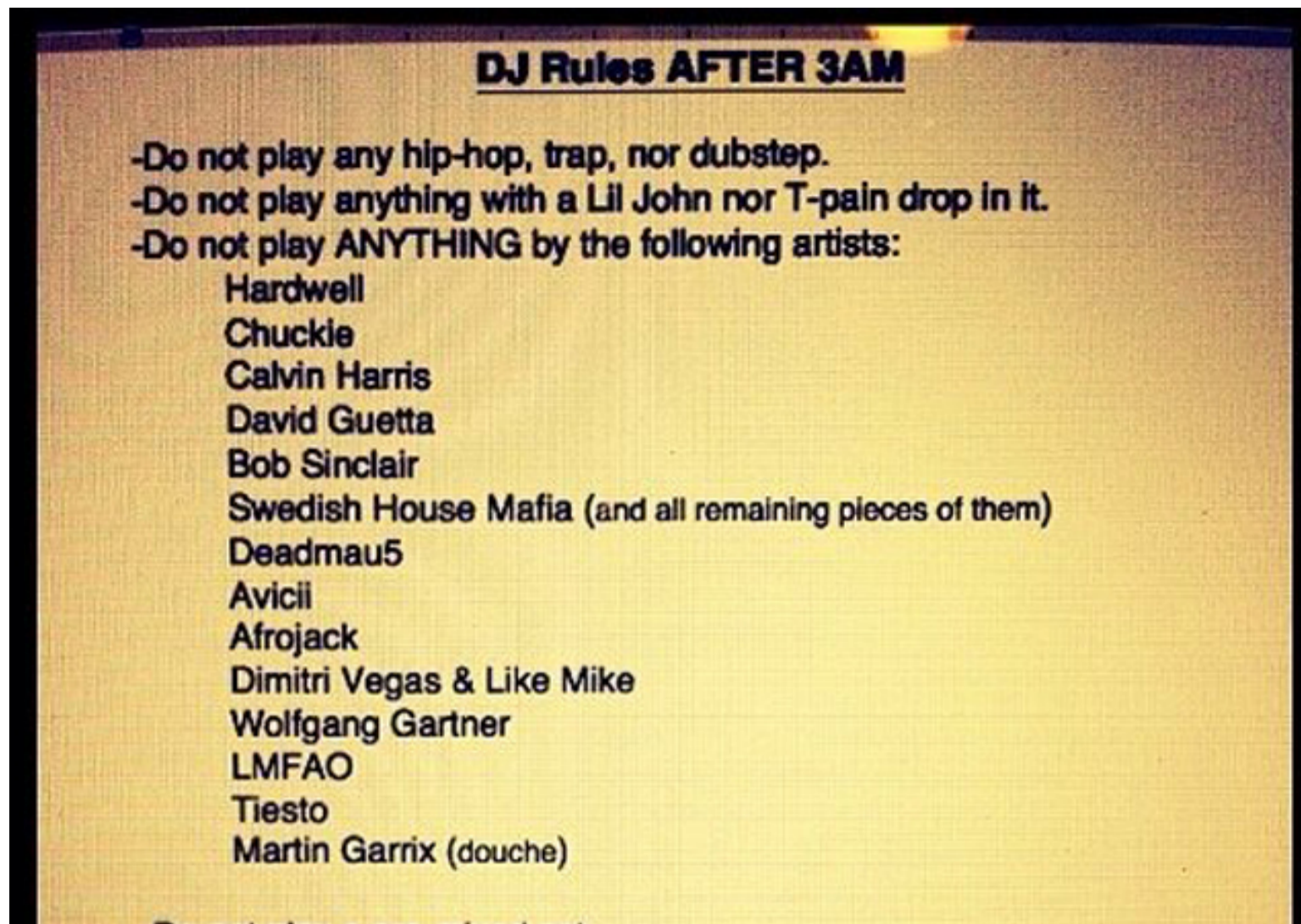


New Vegas club sets strict 'DJ Rules' you don't want to mess with

Proudly displayed in the DJ booth, the 'Rules After 3am' pull no punches.
